BANK CASHIER MISSING.

RICHMOND, Mo., Jan. 4.—A. M. Fowler, President of the Ray County Bank, stated this afternoon that Cashier John W. Shotwell, Jr., has been missing since Monday last, and that a State Bank Examiner is going over the books.

What shortage, if any, may exist will not be known, he said, until the bank examiner has finished his work. Mr. Fowler stated, however, that the stockholders of the bank had held a meeting and subscribed \$21,000 to cover any shortage that may be found. The business of the institution continues as usual.

The bank is one of the oldest in the State. It has a capital of \$50,000 and deposits of \$75,000.

WANTS JUDGMENT SET ASIDE.

Justice Blanchard, in the Supreme Court, yesterday, reserved decision on the application of Dr. John J. Kindred to have set aside a judgment for \$23,000 obtained against him by George C. Spann, a lawyer. The judgment was obtained by default on the claim that Mr. Spann had been drugged while in a sanitarium conducted by Dr. Kindred at Stamford, Conn.

Dr. Kindred declares in his answer that he was never properly served with the summons and complaint, and that he knew nothing about the judgment being obtained. He also denies the charges made against him.
